

CHILD AND YOUTH CARE

A 120-credit program

You can enter at 1st year. You will need to complete 2 English/CMNS courses within your first year of course work.

If you have previous university course work, you can enter into the appropriate year based on your previous relevant university credits.

You may ladder into the CYC program with a certificate or diploma in an approved human services field.



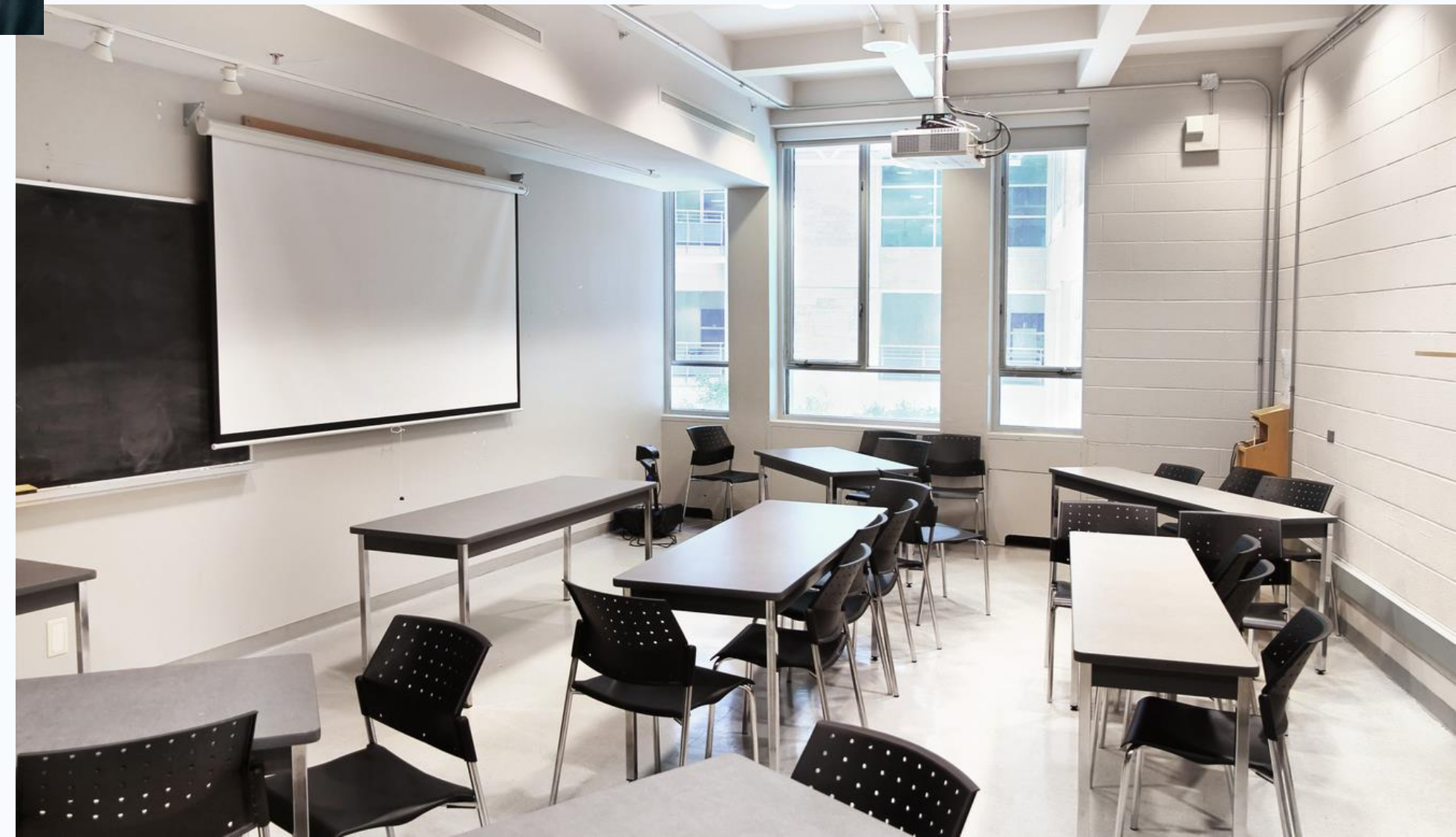
PROGRAM DETAILS

HOW COURSES ARE SCHEDULED

Core courses are offered in the evenings, specifically 4pm - 7pm and 7pm - 10pm, generally Mondays to Thursdays, though some are offered on Saturdays too

PRACTICUM REQUIREMENTS

It should be noted that while most courses are in the evening, two practicum courses (CYC 310 and CYC 410) are part of the curriculum, and have very different expectations for hours.

While there is much flexibility in the times required for practicum, students are to prepare for working on practicum sites during the day primarily or in combination with evenings or weekends, depending on the needs of the site.

You need to be available and flexible in your schedule when you sign up for practicum.

CRIMINAL RECORD CHECK

In all cases, a Criminal Record Check (CRC) will be required prior to placement at the site.

Apply for your Criminal Records Check in 2nd year so there is no delay in your placement in 3rd year. CRCs last 5 years.

3RD YEAR PLACEMENT

3rd year is a “stretching” practicum, you will be placed in a different setting, or with a different population or age group than you have experienced in the past. You can expect to at your placement approximately 8-10 hours per week for 2 semesters.

4TH YEAR PLACEMENT

In 4th year, expect this to be a “career-focused” practicum experience, done over 2 semesters or as a block, depending on the requirements of the setting.

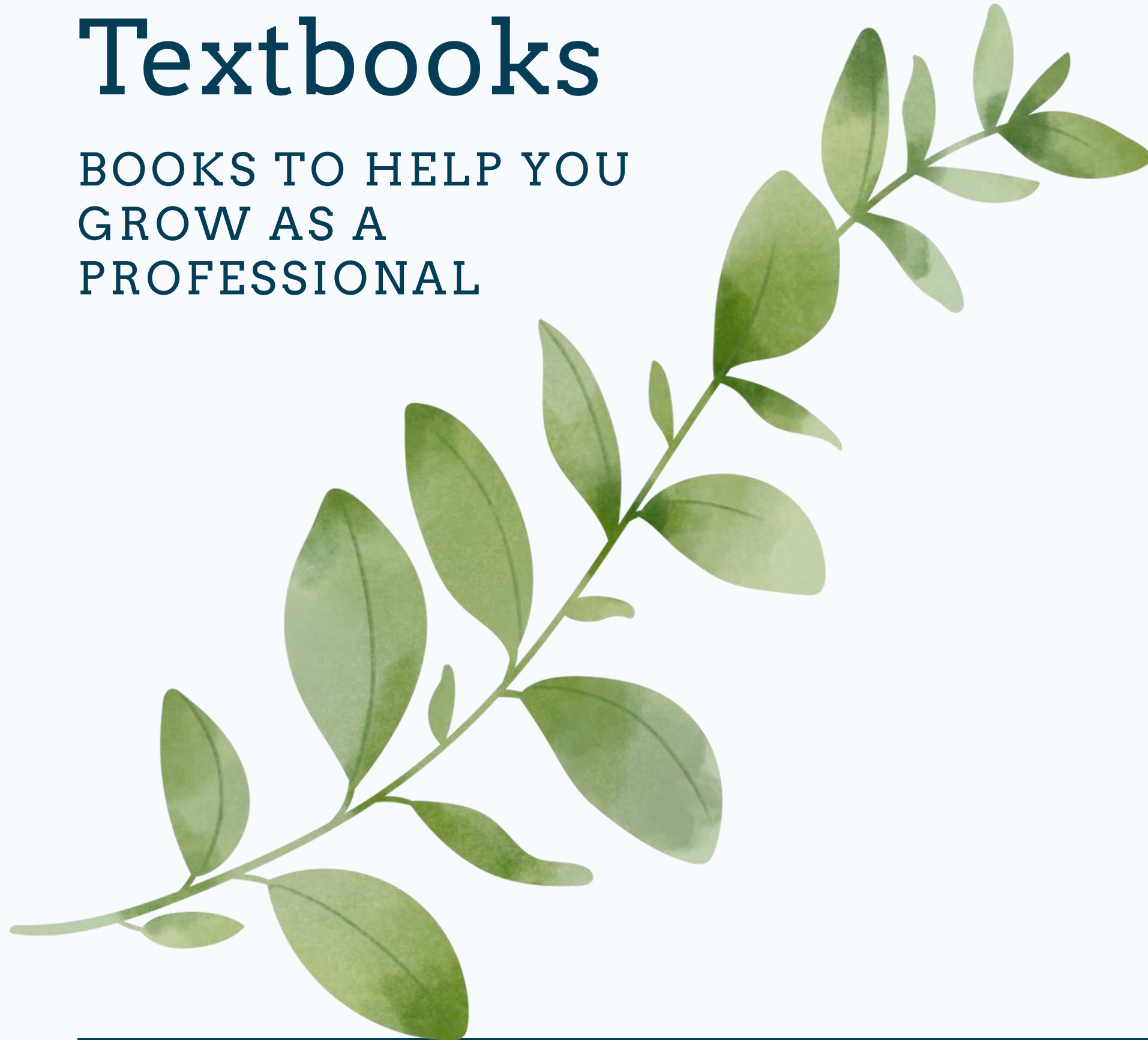

You will need to have the textbooks for courses. These textbooks will always be listed through the UFV Bookware system at <https://ufv.bookware3000.ca/Course/campus>

Texts range from \$50 to \$200 per course. Please note that the bookstore does not always order enough copies of each text, so you may need to make other arrangements to access these texts.

Some instructors will require Course Packs or will provide articles for assigned readings on Blackboard Learn our online learning system

Technology requirements

It is essential that students have access to reliable and current technologies in order to complete assignments, research, and importantly, to communicate with faculty and classmates... these past two years this has been more important than ever!



Other program considerations

WELLNESS

To obtain future employment in this field, you will need to be able to demonstrate suitable physical and emotional health. This is confidential matter between UFV and you, and no information disclosed will be shared outside of UFV without your consent

COMMUNICATION

Coursework frequently requires small group work and public speaking. Coursework involves dealing with interpersonal communication, resolving conflict and negotiating work amid diverse opinions and learning styles in mature and productive ways.

FOCUS & STAMINA

Class times may range from 2 to 3 hours in length, and you may have 2 classes in one evening, back-to-back. This requires the ability to stay mentally focused and have the necessary physical stamina.

COLLABORATION

You will be expected to be open, willing to give and receive feedback , critically evaluate your own performance, and make yourself available for group work and study outside of scheduled hours.

Course content involves sensitive topics such as trauma, physical or sexual abuse. family issues, and addictive patterns of behaviour.

1. Academic entrance requirements
2. Attend an orientation (held in March)
3. Letter of intent
4. Transcript(s)
5. Questionnaire
6. Resume
7. Two reference letters (volunteer or work)





WHAT HAPPENS AFTER YOU APPLY?

CHECK YOUR APPLICATION STATUS

Log into UFV's application portal and view your application status.

You will receive an important email to your personal email address. It contains your UFV ID, and instructions for logging into UFV's application portal.

ADMITTED

If you are admitted, you will receive an official letter of acceptance. Remember, your acceptance may be conditional. A conditional acceptance means you're still finishing up your entrance requirements.

What happens next?

WE ACCEPT APPLICATIONS UNTIL MARCH 31ST

Those who have complete application packages (that is all the documents requested are received and prerequisite courses taken) are considered

Faculty committee decisions in April

New students are advised in early May

You will receive an official letter of acceptance if you are accepted into your program. Your acceptance may be conditional, you will be given a timeline to provide proof of completion (ex. Currently enrolled high school students will normally have a timeline of August 3 for Fall semester).
