2. Presentation

2.1 Margaret Coombes, Alison Prichard Orr, Renee Prasad present on research with the community.

Alison Prichard Orr – Alison described how her research with community organizations began initially through her involvement with the community. Important aspects of working with organizations were:

- a.** Get to know the people in the community first, then work on a relationship.
- b.** Build a relationship and trust between UFV and the organization by being involved with them through such things as attending AGM's, events etc.
- c.** Ask the organization what their needs are and base research focus around those needs.
- d.** Ensure that there is community interest and recognition of the community organization, and share research findings with the community organization.
- e.** Ensure the UFV reputation is upheld throughout the research project.
- f.** There has to be some benefit for the organization. Affiliation with a research study is a good benefit.
- g.** Be pro-active

Margaret Coombes – Margaret described her research with community organizations and how it evolved from existing research prior to her work in academia. Once teaching, Margaret ensured a continued involvement with community organizations that were related to her field and much like Alison’s experience, led to her current research projects. In addition to Alison’s points, Margaret mentioned some additional points:

- a. Recognize how your own skills can assist the organization and ask what the current needs of the organization are.
- b. Flexibility and adaptability are required when working with community organizations as circumstances can arise that are not anticipated.
- c. Research requests can depend on what are considered “hot topics” at the time.
- d. Once the research findings are shared with the organization, ask them where they think it should go next.

Renee Prasad – Renee’s research focus is in agriculture and she began her research with community organizations while in Graduate School working with local farmers. This began by finding the extension agent or specialist liaison between researchers and growers. Renee gave a lot of good additional examples of how to engage with the community, how to continue the engagement throughout the research process, and the benefits of doing research with community organizations such as:

- a. Be a speaker at events which involve the community partners/organizations.
- b. Attend talks and meetings put on by the community partners/organizations.
- c. Build a relationship with organizations who may provide funding so that they have a clear understanding of the funding requests once received.
- d. A good impression goes a long way and helps to ensure UFV is well represented.
- e. A relationship with the community will help increase UFV’s reputation within the community as well.
- f. Collaborating with other institutions helps to complement other larger research being done.

Katherine Watson – Katherine suggested identifying what community is first and deciding where to do the research. Many times the community approaches faculty members asking for assistance with how to conduct data collection, analysis and evaluation. Katherine made the following points to take note of when doing research with community organizations:

- a. It is important to understand the needs of the community you are working with so that research recommendations will best suit their needs.
- b. Pre-planning is very important, be clear about what you can and cannot do. This will help to ensure UFV’s reputation will be upheld.
- c. Networking can lead to future projects.
- d. Students involved in community research learn cross-discipline skills and valuable knowledge about their community, helping them to graduate with the skills required to do good research.

Discussion: How can UFV Researchers best engage with the community?

- a. Think broadly about the connections and networks within the community, not just the obvious connections.
- b. Take advantage of opportunities presented and be involved in the community so you are recognizable and trusted.

- c. Consider the organization and make sure they are aware of the time required before data can be released.
- d. Deliver something relevant to the community and match their expectations.
- e. Do not take on more than you can deliver.
- f. Be open to cross-disciplinary work.
- g. Reinforce and continue relationships even when things change within projects.
- h. Hold a RAC meeting out in the community to bring awareness around potential for research collaboration.

Research Advisory Council Terms of Reference

1. Mandate

The Research Advisory Council (RAC) provides an interdisciplinary forum for discussion of ideas, issues related to research. RAC *advocates* for research activity within the context of a teaching intensive university. RAC provides an *opportunity* for research-oriented faculty members at UFV to come together to discuss topics related to research, to support research-based initiatives, and to stimulate discussion and profile research activity at UFV. RAC will provide advice and support to the AVP Research, Engagement, & Graduate Studies and other UFV decision-making bodies such as the Senate Standing Committee for Research.

The RAC shall:

1. Initiate and plan activities and events related to research, to inspire and facilitate institution wide discussion. These activities and events may take place within RAC meetings themselves.
2. Provide a forum where new research, scholarly initiatives, good research practice, and new ideas can be discussed and reviewed in an inter-disciplinary context.
3. Provide a space in which research-minded faculty can network and have a collective voice.
4. Support the visibility of research by profiling and disseminating information about research activities and good research practice.
5. Support and advocate for student research opportunities.
6. Act as a resource for faculty regarding the scholarship of teaching and learning.
7. Act as a resource to new faculty to support them in the development of their research and scholarly activity.
8. Consult with and advise program areas on matters related to research and the integration of research and teaching.
9. Establish committees, as required, to address and/or advise on emerging issues as they relate to research, creative, and scholarly activities.
10. Consider and review UFV's strategic, strategic research, and education plans, policies and practices to assess the implications for research and the integration of research and teaching. These may be requested by the AVP Research, Engagement & Graduate Studies, Senate Research Committee (SRC), or other UFV bodies. Advice may be sought on the content, interpretation, and implementation of plans and policies.
11. Provide liaison to related groups such as the Teaching and Learning Advisory Council (TLAC) and others.

2. Membership

Voting members:

Two faculty members who are researchers, delegated by each faculty: Arts (2 from Social Sciences and 2 from Humanities), Access and Continuing Education, Applied and Technical Studies, Health Sciences, Science, and Professional Studies.

University Librarian or designate

Chair or Vice-Chair of the UFV Human Research Ethics Board

Directors / leaders of each UFV research institute, centre, or lab: Agriculture Centre of Excellence, Centre for Food and Farmland Innovation, Centre for Global Development, Centre for Social Research, Centre for Education and Research on Aging, Centre for Public Safety and Criminal Justice Research, South Asian Studies Institute, Luminescence Dating Lab and Molecular Modeling Lab.

Research Chairs: Canada India Partnership Development, Food Security and the Environment, Health and Community, and Aboriginal Studies.

3. Chair

Every second year at its regular May meeting, the RAC will elect a Chair and a Vice-Chair from its membership. The selection of the Chair and Vice-Chair may be deferred at the request of RAC to September. In the event of an election, voting may occur by ballot.

The Chair (or designate) is a member of the Senate Research Committee ex-officio. The Chair is responsible for liaison with the Research Office. In his/her absence, the Vice-Chair will provide liaison or attend meetings.

4. Regular Meetings

The Council shall hold meetings in September, November, January, March and May each year. The Council may also meet at the call of the Chair, or at the request of the AVP Research, Engagement, & Graduate Studies or the Chair of the Senate Research Committee. In the event that a vote must be taken on specific recommendations made to the AVP or other UFV decision-making body, a quorum shall be 50% plus 1 of voting members.

All meetings of the Council are open to all UFV faculty, staff and students wishing to attend.

5. Proceedings

A summary record of the proceedings and recommendations of the Council will be produced and circulated by the Assistant to the AVP Research, Engagement, & Graduate Studies.
