7.2 Advising Centre – Karen Cooper

- 7.2.1 Congratulations to Stan Manu who has taken over the Science Faculty Advisor position. Cory B. will be finishing up his duties in June. Now that Faculty Advising has moved under Peter Geller's office the Faculty of Science is required to pay for their releases. Lucy advised that the Dean's discretionary funds were used to help cover the release.
- 7.2.2 103 students applied to graduate this year. Only 3-4 students were denied. There were 8 Associate Degrees, 9 Mechatronics, 9-10 Data Analysis Certificates (DAC).
- 7.2.3 UFV Orientation went well. It was combined with Campus Student Life. There were 3 nights (2 held at Abbotsford Campus and 1 at the Chilliwack CEP Campus). The registration workshop was huge success that it had to be moved into the gym.

Lucy advised that the Indigenous requirement change will be discussed at the next Senate meeting on June 10, 2016. Allan A. shared he was recently in Whitehorse. They provided a 2 day workshop on Indigenous learning practices. He suggested UFV should consider something similar.
