1. GUESTS and INTRODUCTIONS

Darren Francis, Deputy Registrar: Degree Works and the Continuance Policy

Degree Audit Software

- System Advisor software will support the role of an advisor with the ability for students to access information on a particular program path, this will allow student to determine what courses need to be taken, remain to be completed, and are required if switching to a different path.
- This software program will be helpful to individual departments based on varying methods of recording/assessing courses demand; provide a consistent method for viewing degree requirements, transfer credits, and student progress. Automated graduation eligibility notification and identification of students at risk of not complying with program requirements.
- Beta testing is scheduled for Convocation. If successful, it will be released to advisors in Fall 2015 and students in Fall 2016.
- This program is not designed to make advisors obsolete, more to enhance type of advising for students. The goal is to shift advising appointments from descriptive meetings focused on checking boxes on a spreadsheet to developmental conversations. Students will already know how far they are in their program and can use their appointments to discuss other concerns such as how to choose a graduate school or enrich their degree with volunteer opportunities.

Continuance Policy

- The Continuance Policy was implemented in Fall 2013, so we have completed the first year of the policy's existence. This policy is university-wide and states that all students must maintain a GPA of 2.0. Three consecutive semesters below this threshold results in mandatory withdrawal. Students that are required to withdraw can take upgrading courses immediately or leave UFV for 2 semesters.
- In Winter 2015, 33 students received required to withdraw (RTW) status.
- Of these 33 students, 28 were withdrawn from Winter 2015 courses. The average credit load of these students was 8.89.

3. DEAN'S REPORT

- **Adult Education**
 - The Ministry of Advanced Education has said that Adult Basic Education (ABE) courses (including Continuing Education, ESL, and developmental courses) will no longer be free. Universities have the option to charge for tuition.
 - As a regional university, UFV has to offer developmental courses and has a quota of FTEs that must be maintained. Part of each department's budget is a grant that includes support for developmental courses, but the Ministry will not be providing the extra grants it has supplied in the past. A task force has been struck to decide if UFV will charge tuition or not.
- Lucy went to Peru in December and has begun discussions for memoranda of understanding from these universities: Universidad Agraria de la Molina in Lima Peru and Universidad Santiago Antunez de Mayolo in Huaraz. Both are strong in agriculture and could result in an exchange program.
- The memorandum of understanding with Universidad Catolica de Valparaiso from Chile is being moved through the International office and administration.

MOTION: The Faculty of Science <u>supports</u> that all full-time, non-probationary, <u>post 3-year cycle</u> lab instructors be regularized as Assistant Professors at a minimum, and that those lab instructors whose duties have developed beyond those described in the collective agreement (i.e. first-year labs) be regularized as Associate Professors.

Moved by Norm T. / 2nd by Pat H. 1 against. 1 abstained. Carried.
