6. FSCC (Curriculum Committee)

6.1 DECISION

6.1.1 Biology Concentrations – change to Pre-Medicine, Pre-Veterinary, Ecology, and Biology of Organisms

Recommendation from departmental review was to reduce the amount of concentrations. Therefore, combinations have been created.

QUESTION: Pre-med/Pre-vet – students interested in either/or...What is the purpose of these concentrations if students are going forward to medicine or veterinary schools? ANSWER: It is good for the student if they have the concentration on their student record in case they plan on going to medicine or vet in the future. Although, there is no guarantee that these courses cover the extent of necessary courses required for other institutions.

MOTION: That Faculty Council approve of the changes to the Biology Concentrations as presented and forward to UEC.

- 7.4.5 Discussion: BSc Programming Requirements for the Bachelor of Science Degree
 - Suggest more Excel training
 - CIS department is looking at creating a new course and is receiving additional feedback from other areas. Programming offers some structured thought for the students and this new program would include programming aspects of it as well as other software programs.
 - Geography has also had similar discussions.
 - This requires a bigger discussion regarding the BSc Requirement discussion. What do students need to have, what is useful and what should be required? Right now some students could bypass programming course by taking COMP 125.
 - Some faculty members spend time teaching Excel in class when it may be unnecessary.
 - Students are commenting that the current programming course is not relevant to their studies. Most biology majors, programming is not necessary.
 - Other institutions have computer science as an option, not a requirement.
 - There is currently discussions in place with CIS and biology and a concept memo will be brought back to Faculty Council.

- Faculty of Professional Studies have been discussing the possibility of offering a 'foundations' course that would teach a variety of different software programs.

7.4.6 PROFESSIONAL STUDIES

- Faculty Standards Committee has met and a draft document has been presented to Faculty Council which includes a set of principles, key activities/sample activities/sample evidence. Using Mount Royal University as an example because they are similar to UFV.
