# 5.2. <u>Draft Policy – Undergraduate Directed Studies, Special Topics & Independent Study Courses</u>

Much discussion was had regarding whether or not this policy was necessary or should it be divided into 3 separate policies, as each section seems to be unique.

- Is it necessary to state some of the "Deans' roles" because it seems to be already understood.
- Policy was created to bring in some consistency across UFV as a whole.
- Directed Studies could be reworded, there seems to be some confusion as regarding the department's role. The Dept. Head could be the "designate". The CRN's need to be available for various reasons. The process seems to be opposite as it is right now. Things are running smoothly, and it was suggested that the change may not be necessary.
- Could be issues with the "6 students per Instructor" the Dean could possibly override.
