#### 4.1. Biology

New course: BIO 315, Equine Biology

# 4.2. Chemistry

New course: CHEM 325, Inorganic Chemistry Laboratory Changes to credits, total hours, and course content (removal of lab): CHEM 321 Changes to credits, total hours, and course content (removal of lab): CHEM 421

There were some concerns about the proposed changes to CHEM 321 and 421, and the new CHEM 325.

One particular concern was the direction that students "should" take CHEM 325 with one of the other courses, rather than requiring it as a pre/corequisite. UEC suggested that it might be appropriate to list CHEM 325 as a pre/corequisite for both CHEM 321 and 421, but did not want to make that change without consulting the department.

There were also some questions about how the equivalencies would work for students who may have taken one of the previous versions of CHEM 321 or CHEM 421, and it was suggested that a change to the course number might be appropriate.

These courses were deferred, and the department will be asked to address the concerns.

## 4.3. Geography

Review with changes: GEOG 346

Changes including new cross-listing as GDS: GEOG 340/GDS 340

Revisions: GDS 100

A note will be added to the course description for GEOG 346 indicating that students with BIO 420E cannot take this course for further credit. It was also noted that the evaluation includes 50% for evaluations, although it is more common for mid-term and final exam values to be listed separately. The department will be asked if they would like to amend the evaluation as an editorial change.

### 6. OTHER BUSINESS/DISCUSSION ITEMS

## 6.1. Undergraduate Course and Program Approval policy

Some additional changes to the revised policy were suggested:

- "Clarification of calendar copy" should be removed from the list of minor program changes, as these do not need to go through the approval process.
- Definitions: "minor changes" should be changed to "minor program change".
- Timing: "minimum of 2 weeks" for minor program changes should be changed to "1-4 weeks".
- Dean's approval should be moved so that it does not have to happen prior to CWC, as some Deans are finding this to be cumbersome and unnecessary; the Deans should be given more flexibility to decide where in the process they approve various items.

#### 6.2. Short programs

C. Dahl presented some information on the development of short programs, which include any credentials less than a degree, such as A or B certificates and diplomas. The ministry does not currently provide standards for these programs that are comparable to those for undergraduate degree programs. Without set criteria, it can be difficult to evaluate the merits of new program proposals.

Other challenges related to short programs frequently include a lack of marketing, and difficulty in finding out who the students are (and whether they are successful) since many of these programs are completion certificates only.

C. Dahl proposed that UEC strike an ad-hoc UEC subcommittee to study/review/consider the issue of short programs (within UEC's terms of reference). C. Dahl, J. English, S. Bains, O. Steyn, and S. Hardman volunteered to participate on the committee; other members will be added as the subcommittee deems appropriate. Suggestions for additional members included W. Burton (Teaching and Learning), D. Thompson (chair of the Certificate committee), someone from Continuing Studies, and a representative from each faculty.

#### **MOTION:**

To establish an ad-hoc Short Programs Subcommittee to address the challenges facing short programs and to clarify the institutional expectations of them; to report to UEC and to be recommended to APPC and Senate.

# Course credits and how they are assigned

The subcommittee has started the paperwork for revising this policy, and has identified a process that they intend to recommend to SGC. This will be a major

policy revision, with high stakes for a number of stakeholders throughout the institution (budgetary implications at a number of levels, etc.).

# **Cross-listing**

This has not been extensively discussed yet; A. Wiseman will prepare a survey to find out how other institutions approach this.

# Class size

The collective agreement stipulates that the maximum class size is 36, with any other number determined by the deans. This is not a UEC issue.
