#### 3. UPAC BUSINESS

## 3.1. Social, Cultural, and Media Studies

Cross-listing: LAS 200 cross-listed as SOC 200

Under the cross-listing operating policy, the owner of a course can grant permission for the course to be cross-listed under another discipline, provided all areas are in agreement.

## 3.2. University Foundation

Change to program: Addition of Fashion Design courses

The addition of courses to the University Foundation program can be requested by the department offering the courses, but must be approved by the program head. Fashion Design and UFP program head S. Brigden are in agreement on the addition of these courses.

To approve the addition of FD 180 to Levels 1 and 2 of the UFP, and the addition of FD 193 to Level 2 of the UFP, as presented.

#### 3.3. Graphic Design

Change to program: Graphic Design diploma

The Graphic Design diploma has not been offered for several years. An initial proposal for changes to the program was initially rejected, and it has been redesigned through extensive consultation. This diploma would ladder into the Bachelor of General Studies and into the proposed Bachelor of Fine Arts.

B. Cooke mentioned that the current proposal includes some 300-level courses, although a diploma is generally considered to be years one and two. E. Davis noted that students regularly take 300- and even 400-level courses in their first two years, and so it would not be unusual for students to take 300-level courses before their third year.

**RECOMMENDED TO UCC** 

Revisions and change to course number: GD 317

The proposal includes changing a lower-level course (GD 217) into an upper-level course (GD 317). Although the Arts Curriculum Committee has defined what constitutes an upper- or lower-level course, UCFV does not have institution-wide definitions for these. The Visual Arts Curriculum Committee oversees Graphic Design courses, and ACC definitions have not been applied.

These courses have gone through the standard approval process, and do not need to be further considered by UPAC.

## 3.4. Indigenous Peoples Knowledge

New discipline code: IPK

- S. Hardman of Aboriginal Access Services proposed the creation of a new course code, IPK; the creation of a new course code falls under UPAC's jurisdiction. This discipline will be housed in the Centre for Indigenous Studies, under the Faculty of Arts. B. Cooke distributed a list of all currently existing course codes for reference.
- S. Hardman indicated that "Indigenous" is the term currently being embraced in academic circles, and that communities are being encouraged to use. B. Cooke asked if FNST (First Nations Studies) would eventually be replaced by IPK. S. Hardman indicated that, as "First Nations" refers to a specific set of people, as opposed to the inclusive "Indigenous Peoples", this will likely be the logical next step.

To approve the creation of the Indigenous Peoples Knowledge (IPK) discipline, as presented.
