#### 4.1. Communications - New Certificate

## 4.2. Kinesiology and Physical Education – Program Change

MOTION: B. Cooke/S. Stegmueller

THAT KPE 461 and KPE 481 be approved as electives to the KPE degree program pending clarification by the curriculum committee as to whether these are stream or program electives.

B. Cooke requested that the curriculum committee review the layout of the requirements and clearly indicate what the stream courses are. Clarification is needed as to whether these electives are stream electives, or program electives. It was decided that the curriculum committee would discuss this further at the next meeting.

## 4.3. Physics - Program Changes

MOTION: C. Loten/J. Hogg

THAT the upper level credit requirements for both the double major in Physics and Math be revised. Current requirements are PHYS 381 *Mathematical Physics* plus 27 credits in upper-level Physics. These requirements will be replaced with (PHYS 381 *Mathematical Physics* plus 27 other credits in upper-level Physics) or (PHYS 381 plus 21 credits in upper-level Physics and a major in Mathematics).

## 4.4. Physics - Program Changes

MOTION: S. Stegmueller/ B.Cooke

THAT the fourth- year electives, PHYS 462 and PHYS 472, be renumbered to third-year electives in the Physics degree program as PHYS 362 and PHYS 372 respectively.

The rationale for renumbering the courses is that now they will be accessible to students who have completed second year. PHYS 462/472 were designed when UFV first became a degree granting institution. At that time these courses had PHYS 332/342 as prerequisites; since then the technology has changed, and our constant revision of these courses has made it possible to offer PHYS 462/472 without third year prerequisites (in a previous submission, the third year prerequisites were removed).

The Physics department has considered how the number changes may affect the programs. The majors only specify upper level credits, and so the change has no effect. The honours has two additional requirements that needed to be considered: the required two upper-level labs and third-year prerequisite requirements. The lab requirement is unaffected by this change. The intent of the "third year prerequisite" was to mimic similar requirements at other institutions and make it easier for our students to enter graduate school, but the intent of the requirement was to have students take advanced core physics courses. The potential problem was fixed earlier by removing the third year prerequisites for PHYS 462/472. Changing the numbering now does not affect this earlier correction and makes the honours requirements clearer.

## 4.5. Bachelor of Arts Program Changes

THAT GEOG 116 be added to the list of lab science options in the BA.

#### 5. UPAC PROGRAM AND COURSE APPROVAL FLOWCHARTS

In discussions with departments, areas of concern have been identified regarding the UPAC approval process for courses and programs. A few of the discussion items were as follows:

- Uncertainty as to how faculty approval takes place.
- Some faculties have multiple committees approving programs—process needs streamlining to identify path of approval. Flowchart diagram needs to be adjusted accordingly.
- The online agenda package published one week before the UPAC meeting is available to departments which will help to ensure external heads receive the opportunity to review the programs at UPAC.
- Committee members raised the concern of situations when one department develops a course which might belong in another area. What happens when it crosses disciplines? Deans need to be aware and be part of the process.
- Technology can be purchased to assist with process; however, cost factors and yearly upgrades are factors to be considered.
- Concerns were noted about making changes right now since we're still trying to figure out faculty roles
  within the approval process. Perhaps UPAC can pull together some heads to work on this at a later
  time, particularly in light of the fact that we are already in full tilt in the academic year, making any
  changes at this point awkward.
- It was suggested that it would be beneficial to publish the course outlines as part of the online agenda package. The course outline would still be presented to UPAC as an information item.
- The UPAC Assistant part of the flowchart in the program and course approval will be removed.
- The UPAC Assistant facilitates flow between department and UPAC.
