# **6.2.** Revision to MATH 111 Calculus 1 | MATH 141 Calculus for Business

The calendar description to be revised to remove all mention of equivalents between MATH 111 and MATH 141 since there is sufficient new material in each course to warrant credit for each after the other has already been taken.

# **6.3.** Revision to MATH 123 Everyday Math and Stats

Considering the different learning objectives of MATH 123 and MATH 105, students who have taken MATH 105 would stand to learn quite a bit in MATH 123 and deserve full university credit for taking both courses.

6.4. Exception to graduate for Chemistry majors - Recommendation from FSCC FSCC recognizes that neither CHEM 311 nor CHEM 312 was offered in the 2019/2020 academic year so we accept the Chemistry Department's recommendation that CHEM 412G replace CHEM 311 or 312 requirement for students graduating in June 2020 even if it means they may only have 29 upper level chemistry credits.

# **7.1.** <u>Dean's Report</u> - Lucy Lee

  month, please let Lucy know so it can be included in the monthly report.
- Lucy will be away February 20-21 for the Western Dean's Conference.
- The Applied Bioinformatics program is moving along. Final approval should be coming soon. The program will be implemented Fall 2020.
- The working group continues to work on the MIST proposal. The name will need to be revised as it is too general. CIS is also working on a masters proposal which is separate from the sciences.
- Lucy advised that UFV continues to make efforts to recruit indigenous faculty and has positions specifically targeted. Faculty is encouraged to keep this in mind when hiring new faculty.
- Space continues to be an ongoing issue at UFV. There is a possibility of additional
  portables being added due to the temporary moves happening with the building
  renewal project.

- The Campus Planning Working group looks at major decisions on campus. They take requests every year for renovations, additions, and other needs. Last year Chemistry put forward a request for labs - the ICE Lab was approved pending grant funding.
- This is the final year of the current Tenure and Promotion process. Faculty who
  came in as an Assistant Professor will be grandfathered. Lucy advised that
  departmental review committees will need to be renewed. A call for members for
  next year will be forthcoming as well as the University level Review Committee
  (URC) and Appeals Committee.
- The Government of BC now requires that degrees will need to undergo 6-year reviews so the BSc will be due for review.
- There are 3 new faculty positions in science that are currently being advertised:
   Math and Stats which closes today; SoLUEC closes next week; and, the position in
   Biology is closing in March. The new Associate Dean of Science position will follow a
   similar format of the Associate Dean of Students in the College of Arts. The
   advertisement will be coming out soon.

Cindy L. noted that in addition to the space crunch the parking continues to be an issue. Shuttles are being taken to help alleviate the lack of parking, but faculty and staff risk getting kicked off. A suggestion was made to have a 'Faculty Shuttle' or possibly allowing faculty/staff to pay a fee to secure a seat.

**ACTION**: Lucy to send the Shuttle feedback to Senior Administration.

# **7.2.** BSc Committee - Greg Schlitt

- The framework is in place. ARTS is revising the portfolio. There is an upcoming meeting regarding the Portfolio which the BSc Committee has been invited to attend.
- Greg noted that the mandate of the BSc was to revise the BSc but was unsure whether it would also be its role to review the BSc.

#### **7.3.** Advising - Karen Cooper

- The deadline for students to apply to graduate is April 1.
- Advising is currently working with students who are on academic probation. Karen
  advised faculty if they are dealing with a student who is having difficulty in their
  classes to please refer them to Advising.
- Admissions is working on a pilot study and the BSc is part of the group. The program is working at getting information from incoming students earlier.
