4. **DEAN'S REPORT** – Lucy Lee

- Lucy informed council of the Faculty of Science activities since our last meeting. The Chemistry department hosted the Articulation Meeting on May 5th with 26 Chemistry heads from across the province attending. The Math Competition finals were also held on May 5th and had 100+ students in attendance from grades 8-12. Math Mania had several events over the year. The FoS hosted a Science communication Workshop held on May 11th.
- The University just hired a new Canada Research Chair, Cindy Jardine, she promotes Health Science Communications.
- The MIST program is in its final steps in getting the courses collected. Caroline M. will be assisting by assembling the course outlines for the next APPC.
- Allan A. is currently on the Biology field trip in Tofino. This was such a popular event that a second fieldtrip is being offered in July.
- Derek Harnett had his NSERC renewed. He was also featured in the President's Lecture Series held on May 23rd.
- Program reviewers will be here next week for the new BSc in Computing Science. The Physics review is this week.
- Lucy provided an update on her outside activities. She recently became the Interim President of the Canadian Council of Deans of Science and is currently organizing the meeting to be held in June. Her NSERC was renewed for another 5 years.
- Updates on the science enrollments were presented.
- LIYSF 2017 Tessa Webb and Perrin Waldock will be heading to London in July. The FoS was able to secure additional funding so both students could attend.
- The Dean's Medal recipient this year is Miranda Louwerse; and the Faculty of Science Governor General Silver Medal went to Chemistry student, Darryl Wilson.
- The new faculty member for Mathematics & Statistics is Dr. Longlong Huang. She will be starting August 1st. Biology has selected their candidate and the formal announcement will be made soon.
- Shaun Sun is hosting a visiting faculty member from China. Dr. King Lee will be here for a year.
- Lin Long and Tim Cooper are both in Singapore advertising UFV Physics.
- We have 8 LTAs total starting in the fall.

5. BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES

The Nomination Notice for the Science Faculty Vice-Chair position was emailed out by Caroline M. Ben Vanderlei and Greg Schmaltz were both nominated for the position. As the votes were very close it was decided by Lucy to appoint them both for a 2-year term as Co-Vice Chairs for SFC.

8.2 Advising Centre – Karen Cooper

- Karen advised SFC of the new registration order in the fall. Concerned with 2nd year engineering students. If anyone has feedback from their students, let Karen know.
- Declarations poster will be sent out to the department assistants. It is important for the students to declare because of the new degree audit.
- BSc graduates are down this year but increase in mechatronics student graduates.

Ian A. advised SFC that Arts now allows double majors. Discussion followed.

8.4 MIST Grad Courses – Noham Weinberg

At the October 2016 SFC meeting the graduate level course were approved and sent onto Grad Studies. Grad Studies did not accept them as the Learning Outcomes were worded similar to the undergraduate courses. Noham and Linus C. revised the wording. Any change to learning outcomes is a major change. Noham is requesting if the courses can go directly to council in September with the Learning Outcome wording updates. Discussion followed. Wording changes to be circulated to FSCC
