UFV Student Michelle Murray-Schlitt and two of her colleagues from the World University Service of Canada (WUSC) provided an overview of their organization. WUSC is a Canadian non-profit organization dedicated to improving education, employment, and empowerment opportunities for youth around the world. Although the organization has been around for some time, it is only in its early stages at UFV. A discussion followed regarding how we could support this initiative as a faculty. Suggestions: we can offer a liaison to support refugee students who may need support in certain subjects - possibly our Academic Advisor could fill that role. As a faculty it would help to be aware of events going on and to support the initiative.
