#### 6. REPORTS

## **6.1. Dean's Report -** Lucy Lee

- **Fall Semester**: Lucy advised that the fall semester is still being sorted out. UFV is expecting a letter from the Ministry which will help direct how we organize for the fall.
- Renovations: Updates were provided on the current renovations happening on campus including the external renewal of Building D. There are funds available for renovations on the 3rd floor of D building as well. The current plan is to look at switching the Math and Stats offices with some of the Arts offices in B Building; and for CIS and Economics to switch spaces. Lucy did point out that Science needs more space and that has been clear for some time. Renovations to the A Building to include Science is in the Campus Planning 5-year plan.

- **Budget**: As the 20/21 budget year is coming to an end, some areas are in a deficit, but that is to be expected. Our enrollments have been good which has helped with our budget.
- LIYSF Each year science has sent a student to attend the London International Youth Science Forum. We did choose a student last year who will have the opportunity to attend this year, but we did not select an additional student to go from this year since we are currently under a travel ban.
- Lucy thanked everyone for working above and beyond this year. It has been hard on
  everyone's mental health. She advised that Science has nominated individuals for all of
  the UFV faculty awards. Also the AAA Awards for Science will be announced at the SFC
  meeting on May 28.

Students will be registering for the summer starting March 15 with International. Karen asked faculty to let her know if there is a course that isn't normally offered over the summer that they would like Advising to be aware of so they can share that information with the students. - Retirements and updates: Lucy advised that Librarian, Kim Isaac, is retiring and a search will be starting soon for her replacement. Jacqueline Nolte, Dean of the College of Arts, has finished her term. A search is underway for her replacement. John English, Dean of Applied and Technical Studies has retired and Peter Geller is currently Acting Dean. There is a call out for a Temporary Acting Dean for the short term.
