- A request was made to have Facilities reset the classrooms with the desks 2 meters

 front of classrooms but is not sure of when that will happen. She will also follow up
 with plexiglass in the Math Centre. Students are required to wear masks in class
 unless they have an exemption. There are several areas on campus where extra
 masks are available. Lucy will re-share the list of stations.
