A survey was sent out to 147 possible respondents and received a 20% response rate. She will be presenting the results to the Provost and VP Academic in May and will then follow up with a formal report to both Faculties for consideration.
- Victoria Surtees, Teaching & Learning Specialist, Internationalization provided an overview of her position within Teaching and Learning and how she can support our faculty. 6.1. Dean's Report - Lucy Lee

- The Department of Agriculture Technology will be joining the Faculty of Science on May 1st. Dr. Renee Prasad, Department Head; Michelle Morier, Department Assistant; Angela Oscienny, Program Technician; two new faculty members and a new CRC chair which will be announced soon.
- Lucy advised that UFV has begun another search for a new Director of Health and Safety. The SAC has already met and have short-listed candidates.
- UFV announced 4 new Professor Emeriti in science: Greg Schlitt and Erik Talvila from Math and Stats; Noham Weinberg, Chemistry; and Christine Dalton, Biology. Noham and Christine are both retiring in August 2022.
- Congratulations to Biology Associate Professor, James Bedard. He is the recipient of this year's UFV Research Excellence Award.
- Lucy announced that the Faculty of Science has a new NSERC Award winner for a 5-year Discovery Grant. She will announce the name at the next SFC meeting.
- Congratulations to Rhien Hare who has been selected to represent UFV at this year's London Youth Science Forum (LIYSF). She will be travelling to London in person with Annabelle Czihaly, UFV's 2020 LIYSF recipient.
- There are several vacancies within the faculty which are in the process of being filled. These will all be finalized within the next 1-2 months.
- Lucy announced that she is hosting the Canadian Council of Science Dean's Conference from May 27-29 at the Abbotsford Campus. Science Deans from across Canada will be joining in-person and virtually.

• Lucy reminded faculty to share news, publications, grants, etc. so we can include it in our monthly Report to the Provost.

6.2. Advising - Karen Cooper

- Graduates May 5 is the deadline for grades to be in. Faculty are to advise Karen if
 there is a problem meeting the deadline as the timeline is short to have the list of
 graduates approved at Senate.

- Admissions: There are a high number of admissions for the fall. There are 700+ BSc applications, a number of Associate of Science. The BAS is up, Engineering Transfer Program is 22-24, and the Engineering Physics is on hold for a year.
- Karen advised there is a change in the registration system. With the release of Banner 9 they anticipate a much nicer registration process.
- Faculty advisor Karen thanked Jane W. for her time in the Advising office. Welcome to Stan Manu who will begin his 2-year term in September.
- Calendar changes for Fall: Contact Amanda if you have updates so it can make it in.
- Academic Success has moved into VP Students. Encourage your students to sign up and look into being tutors. They really need tutors in the sciences. Applications for the fall semester is open now.
- Faculty of Science Convocation will be in person on June 14 alongside the Faculty of Professional Studies. Lucy encouraged faculty to participate. The in-person convocation is only for the 2022 graduates.
