Territory Acknowledgement



The University of the Fraser Valley campuses are built on the sacred land of the Stó:lō Peoples. Stó:lō Tém:éxw (Stó:lō Land), has been cared for deeply and responsibly by Stó:lō people for thousands of years, and their stewardship continues today. Over the last few hundred years, colonization and Western ideologies have had significant impacts on Stó:lō Peoples' land, culture, and way of life.

To work with sustainability is to respect all living things and to understand the value of the environment, good quality of life, various forms of interdependence, and how they all interconnect with one another.

Sustainable change will only be achieved by following the wisdom and leadership of Indigenous knowledge holders, for their understanding that land means more than territory – that it encompasses ecosystems, social systems, culture, relationships, spirituality, and law – is vital to building a sustainable, resilient, and just society together.
