3. BUSINESS

3.1. New Program - Philosophy Honours, Arts (Wayne Henry)

MOTION

That APPC recommend to Senate the approval of the new Philosophy Honours program.

CARRIED

Discussion: An Honours program is considered a new program but does not require Ministry approval. The students would enter into the Honours option during their final term, but must maintain a 3.5 overall GPA. The DIS course is mandatory along with all of the Major requirements and would require some academic planning.

This was the first time that many APPC members had seen the program assessment grid. The grid is an attempt to assist APPC with assessing new programs. It was suggested that the form be used when concept papers come through and then be used as a reference when full proposals come



through. Should the new program assessment grid be available to the program working committees as a resource?

3.2. New Program - Graphic and Digital Design major, Arts

MOTION

That APPC recommend to Senate, the approval of the new Graphic and Digital Design major program. **CARRIED**

The GDD program began in 2012 at the Mission campus. Some GDD courses have since been successfully offered on the Abbotsford campus. The "T-shaped design" means that along with "deep disciplinary knowledge," including digital and interactive components (the "stem"), students will develop "the ability to collaborate and contribute across boundaries between disciplines" ("the crossbar"). Some courses will have differential fees, meaning some tuition fees will be higher than others because of differing costs associated with running the courses. This new program connects to the needs of the community, and the Program Working Group consulted thoroughly with industry, the ministry, and areas within UFV. Suggest revision to the memo because references to the "stem" of the T can be misunderstood as referring to STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math).

3.3. New Program - Integrated Learning Design associate certificate - Adult Education

MOTION

That APPC recommend to Senate the approval of the new Integrated Learning Design associate certificate.

This certificate will give students a chance to achieve a credential before transferring to the provincial instructors program.
