- The faculty is moving forward in the implementation of ACADEM, an online platform to streamline processes and reports for accreditation items. The pilot is in progress for the School of Business and may extend to the School of Computing in 2025.
- Guest lectures are in development for the BBA Agriculture and BBA Aviation programs. The new Director of Aviation, John Flett, will assist in extending the Aviation program.
- The development of the Master of Computing will be a priority for the academic year. Opeyemi Adesina and Mandeep Pannu were thanked for their work on this project.
