4. Schools & Associate Dean News

4.1. School of Business – *Khyati Shetty*

- The school had their first External Advisory Board meeting of the academic year. Faculty members, staff, and student leaders participated. The meeting received excellent feedback.
- Conair have committed to providing student endowments for the BBA Aviation program.
- The school met with Chinook Helicopters to explore potential collaboration opportunities.
- Faculty members Cindy Stewart, Kevin DeWolde, Mark Breedveld, and Zubair Raja participated in an industry tour organized by the Abbotsford Chamber of Commerce. The goal was to connect with industry players, gather insights, and share those learnings with the school.
- Gerry Gannon continues his pro-bono outreach work with the Royal Canadian Legions.
- Jason Campbell represented the school at the Stó:lō Service Agency's annual golf tournament.
- Jelena Brcic was congratulated for receiving a research grant from Public Service Canada.
- The school partnered with the UFV Student Union Society for Student Wellness Week. Khyati Shetty delivered a workshop on emotional fitness.
- Kevin DeWolde hosted a guest lecture and explored collaboration opportunities with a university in Germany.
- Felicia Chong has been selected by the nomination committee as the school's new Research Coordinator for the next two years.

4.2. School of Computing – Opeyemi Adesina

- Ismail El Sayad and his students have been accepted to present their paper at an international conference.
- After completing their COMP 440 projects with Frank Zhang, two students received full scholarships to York University to continue their studies in the Master of Science program.
- After completing COMP 440 under the supervision of Opeyemi Adesina, a student had successfully secured a full-stack junior developer position with Cascade Aerospace.
- Frank Zhang was elected as the Co-Chair for the 26th Western
 Canadian Conference on Computing Education. Frank was also elected
 as the Treasurer for the Western Canada Computing Education Society
 and the Co-Chair of the BC Computing Education Articulation
 Committee.

- Opeyemi Adesina invited his former student, who presently works as a junior developer with Cascade Aerospace, to his software engineering course to discuss best practices for developing impactful industry-scale projects.
- Omer Wagar and Frank Zhang had recent publications.

- Kevin shared example templates for micro-credentials. The examples
