- **Diversity in education**
- Diversity refers to the **range of identities** that exist in a group of people [. . . including] race, class, gender, religion and sexual orientation.
- Diversity in education represents a broad range of ideas and initiatives to **create learning environments that are safe, inclusive and equitable for all.**

Your map

Debrief

- What did you learn that you did not previously know about the Fraser Valley from working with others on the map?
- What did you learn from your group members? What kind of knowledge did each group member contribute that others did not have? How did this make your map more interesting and persuasive to visitors?
- Did sharing your knowledge improve your final map? Why or why not?

Reflecting on diversity

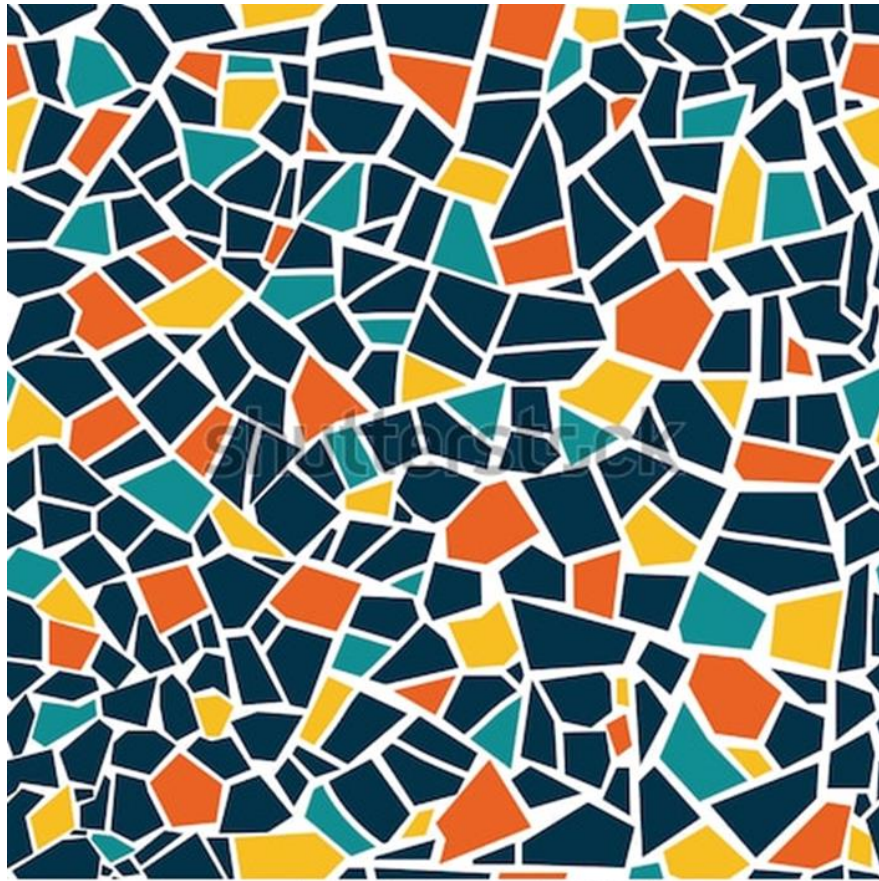
- The purpose of this workshop was to get you to recognize the value of diverse views and ways of seeing the world.
